

## IVF – Donor Agreement Checklist

1. Your Name

2. Are you married or in a de facto relationship? How long?
3. Name of other party to the arrangement
  - a. Address
  - b. DOB
4. Is this party married or in a de facto relationship? How long?
5. Are you married or in a de facto relationship? How long?
6. How long have the agreement parties known each other?
7. Does either party have any existing children? If so, how many, their location and name of other parent.
8. Which doctor is your treating clinician?
9. Does the donor have a treating clinician?
10. Do both parties reside in Victoria? Yes/ No. If no, where?

11. Are both parties Australian Citizens? Yes/no. If not, what citizenship applies?
  
12. Does either party have dual citizenship or are they a resident in any other country? If yes, where?
  
13. Have criminal record checks and child protection checks been completed for all parties? Yes/ No.
  
14. Has the doctor approved treatment? Yes/No.
  
15. Have you previously given birth to a live child? Yes/No.
  
16. Have both parties to the arrangement received counselling and legal advice? (or are they in the process of arranging this?) Yes/no.
  
17. Is the child expected to be born in Victoria? Yes/No. If not, where?
  
18. What 'dispute resolution' mechanism would the parties wish to put in place? What is your plan to address any issues that may arise during the course of the agreement? Yes/No.
  
19. Has either party received counselling from an independent psychologist?
  
20. Do you both have proof of age, please provide us with a copy (e.g. driver's license, passport or birth certificate)?
  
21. Are you both agreed as to the legal status of the child e.g. nationality (may be eligible for citizenship by descent if dual citizenship)?
  
22. What happens in the event of medical complications during the process?
  
23. What happens if the pregnancy fails?

24. What happens if the child is found to be disabled or unwell?
  - a. In utero
  - b. After birth
25. What happens in the event of multiple births?
26. What happens with a later IVF pregnancy, timing and the donor's role/consent?
27. Confirm how the birth is to be registered.
28. How is the donor known to you?
29. What role is the donor to play, if at all, during the pregnancy?
30. What occurs if the donor changes his mind?
31. What arrangements are in place if the donor does not intend to be available and known to the child but changes his mind?
32. What arrangements are in place if you change your mind?
33. What if either you or the donor moves interstate or overseas?
34. After the child is born what occurs if you or the child become unwell or die? What role does the donor play, if any?

35. What financial arrangements are in place?
  
36. What non-financial arrangements, not mentioned above, are in place?
  
37. Have you planned for how you will manage the donor's relationship, if at all, with the child? If so, how?
  
38. Is there any possibility of any visitation arrangements into the future?
  
39. Have either you or the donor had a previous marriage and/or children?
  
40. Do you intend to ultimately provide your children with information and records about the donor? If so what arrangements have been made?
